Hummingbirds 101 on March 24, 2014 6:00 p.m.

For those of us that spend lots of time at the Hummer House, it is easy to take the thousands of birds residing on the ranch for granted. Having banded birds on the ranch for some years, I often concentrate on a particular species for one of my projects and fail to appreciate the truly incredible numbers and the wide variety of bird life present there throughout the year. At the end of the 2013 season, 154 species of birds and two hybrids have been banded there. Unless something unforeseen occurs, we will reach 50,000 birds banded on the ranch before 2014 is very old. We will also exceed 16,000 hummingbirds soon after they return from their annual trip to Mexico for the winter. The ranch continues to host the largest concentration of Black-chinned Hummingbirds and Painted Buntings in the United States. Although the numbers are impressive, the variety is just as impressive. Besides the large numbers of species banded on the ranch which are mostly songbirds and hummingbirds, there are many other species of raptors, waterfowl, and others that are not targeted for banding. They are not part the figures noted above. They are, however, present much of time on the ranch. Because the ranch is located in an area visited by eastern and western birds, we will continue to add to our total of banded birds for the ranch. Where else could you visit and see Eastern, Western, and Mountain Bluebirds in the same place? Where else would you have the possibility of seeing eastern warblers, Western Tanagers, and Blackheaded Grosbeaks all in the same stretch of the South Concho River? If you love birds or just love the outdoors, we hope that you have opportunity to share in the birds of the Hummer House this season. Remember the Hummer House is a private ranch and birding is by invitation. The Observation Room will be open on Saturdays from 10 to 4 starting in May through August. Please call to make arrangements to visit this unique place and enjoy the wonders of nature.
